Medication Management of Behavioral Health Conditions

If you're a primary care provider (PCP), you can diagnose and treat UnitedHealthcare Community Plan members with anxiety, depression and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD). The services you can provide include medication management of prescriptions, and other diagnostic tests needed to diagnose and treat members for these behavioral health conditions. You don't have to be the member's assigned PCP to treat them.

Medication-Assisted Treatment

If you treat a member for opioid use disorder (OUD), you must follow the state's requirements:

- Use Food and Drug Administration-approved medications.

- Refer the member to a behavioral health care provider for the psychological and/or behavioral therapy.
- Coordinate the member's care with the behavioral health care provider.

SAMHSA Required Physician Training and Waiver

If you are treating a member with OUD and need to prescribe buprenorphine, physicians must qualify for a physician waiver through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), which includes completing eight hours of required training.
