



UnitedHealthcare Community Plan of Delaware PPACA Medicaid Primary Care Physician (PCP) Increase Update

UnitedHealthcare Community Plan of Delaware went live with the PPACA increased reimbursement rates for eligible Evaluation & Management (E&M) and vaccine administration CPT codes on Sept. 23, 2013. For claims processed with a submitted date 9/23/2013 or later, all eligible claims with the applicable CPT codes are being reimbursed on a transactional level. Physicians and midlevel providers who attested prior to 7/1/2013 and are eligible will receive the PPACA PCP increase through the standard provider remit advice (PRA) process, once each claim has been processed. The remit will contain specific coding remarks related to PPACA for proper payment reconciliation.

Reprocessing of Claims back to Jan. 1, 2013

Claims prior to Sept. 23, 2013 are being reprocessed to provide the additional reimbursement for the eligible CPT codes. The reprocessed claims will also appear on future remits with specific coding remarks related to PPACA for proper payment reconciliation. ***The fee-for-service process applies to participating and non-participating providers, if eligible.***

Primary Care Self-Attestation form

Self-Attestations completed on or after July 1, 2013, will authorize increased payments effective on the date of completion of the attestation going forward. Only one attestation is needed for the two-year period the increased payments are in effect.
