

# Providing access to a wealth of knowledge with Community Computers.

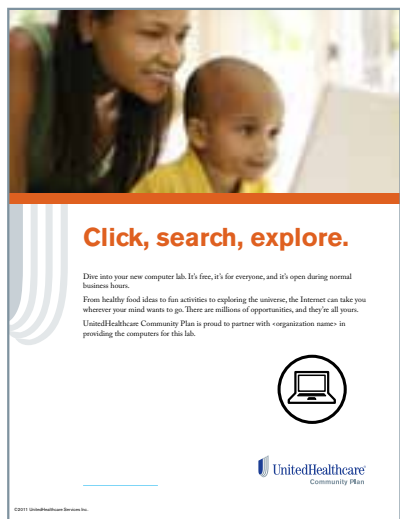
Our Community Computers program helps community and faith-based organizations establish their own on-site computer labs with used computers that we donate. It's a win-win for everyone, because it helps us extend the usable life of our older computers, and puts them in the hands of people who can really use them.

## How Community Computers works.

We donate our reconditioned used computers to community organizations and help them set up computer labs for their clients to use. Because we have a limited number of computers available, we are asking interested organizations to tell us why they would be an ideal partner for this program via a simple application. To be eligible for the computer donation, organizations must designate a dedicated space for the computer lab and provide high-speed Internet access for the computers.

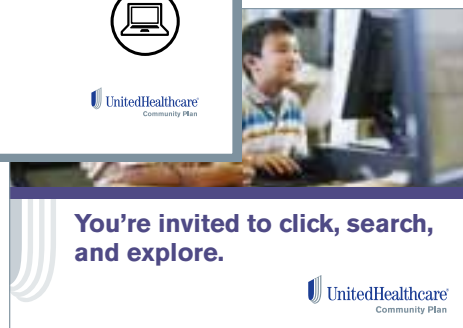

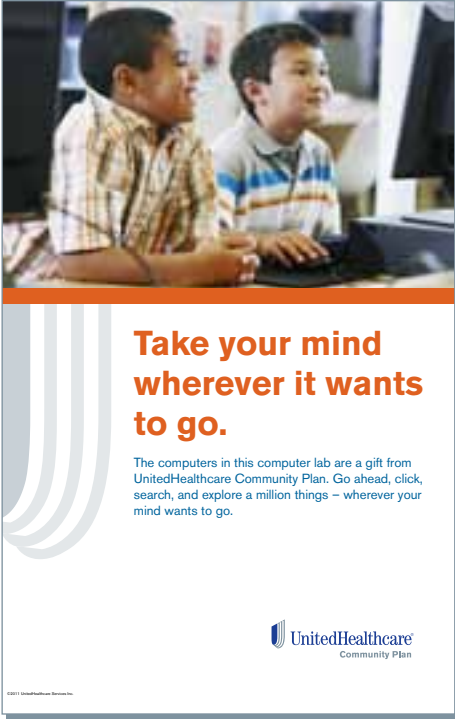
## Grand-opening celebrations.
