



**Arizona Physicians IPA Children's Rehabilitative Services Announces  
New State-of-the-Art Clinic Location in Phoenix – Coming Fall 2012!**

We are excited to announce that in partnership with District Medical Group (DMG) the Phoenix Multi-Specialty Interdisciplinary Clinic (MSIC) will move to a new facility in Central Phoenix in the fall. The new MSIC location will serve more than 15,000 Phoenix-area Children's Rehabilitative Services (CRS) program members.

District Medical Group (DMG) is a not-for-profit faculty practice plan consisting of more than 350 providers who represent all the major medical and surgical specialties and subspecialties. It will serve as the MSIC administrator and is building the new facility which is located at 320 East McDowell. This new state-of-the-art facility will provide an array of family medicine, surgery and pediatric services. St. Joseph's Hospital Children's Health Center will continue to provide services through the transition to the new facility in October 2012. Member benefits will remain the same before and after the addition of DMG.

CRS is an Arizona Medicaid program serving more than 24,000 members statewide, including more than 15,000 in the Phoenix area. The CRS program is administered by Arizona Physicians IPA Children's Rehabilitative Services brought to you by UnitedHealthcare Community Plan. The program specializes in administering needed health care services for individuals with chronic or disabling health conditions, helping to improve the health and quality of life for children by providing family-centered medical treatment, rehabilitation and related support services.

In addition to the new facility, the Arizona Physicians IPA-CRS network includes the Children's Clinics for Rehabilitative Services in Tucson, the Flagstaff Medical Center Children's Health Center and the Yuma Regional Medical Center Children's Rehabilitative Services. St. Joseph's Hospital Children's Health Center will continue to provide services through the transition to the new DMG facility in Phoenix. Arizona Physicians IPA-CRS has a contract with the State of Arizona to administer the CRS program until Sept. 30, 2013. Statewide, there are about 2,900 specialists in the CRS care provider network.
